### STEPHEN: A MAN OF GOD - Acts 6:1-8:8

### 1. Stephen was full of faith and of the Holy Spirit.

They chose Stephen, a man <u>full of faith</u> and <u>of the Holy Spirit</u>... <sup>6</sup> They presented these men to the apostles, who <u>prayed</u> and <u>laid their hands on them</u>. <sup>7</sup> So <u>the word of God spread</u>. The number of disciples in Jerusalem <u>increased rapidly</u>, and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith. Acts 6:5b-7 NIV

#### 2. Stephen was full of God's grace and power.

Now Stephen, a man <u>full of God's grace</u> and <u>power</u>, performed great wonders and signs among the people. Acts 6:8 NIV

### 3. Stephen was full of God's wisdom.

Opposition arose, however, from members of the Synagogue...<sup>10</sup> But they could not stand up against the wisdom the Spirit gave him as he spoke. Acts 6:9-10 NIV See also Acts 6:3.

### 4. Stephen's face was like the face of an angel.

Then they secretly persuaded some men to say, "We have heard Stephen speak blasphemous words against Moses and against God." <sup>12</sup> So they stirred up the people and the elders and the teachers of the law. They seized Stephen and brought him before the Sanhedrin. <sup>13</sup> They produced false witnesses... <sup>15</sup> All who were sitting in the Sanhedrin looked intently at Stephen, and they saw that <u>his face was like the face of an</u> angel. Acts 6:11-13a, 15 NIV

# 5. Stephen knew the Scripture and proclaimed its truth.

Acts 7:1-50

"You stiff-necked people! Your hearts and ears are still uncircumcised. You are just like your ancestors: You always resist the Holy Spirit!

52 Was there ever a prophet your ancestors did not persecute? They even killed those who predicted the coming of the Righteous One. And now you have betrayed and murdered him—

53 you who have received the law that was given through angels but have not obeyed it." Acts 7:51-53NIV

## 6. Stephen saw the glory of God and Jesus.

When the members of the Sanhedrin heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him. <sup>55</sup> But Stephen, <u>full of the Holy Spirit</u>, looked up to heaven and <u>saw the glory of God</u>, and <u>Jesus standing at the right hand of God</u>. <sup>56</sup> "Look," he said, "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God." Acts 7:54-56 NIV

#### 7. Stephen prayed for and forgave his murderers.

At this they covered their ears and, yelling at the top of their voices, they all rushed at him, <sup>58</sup> dragged him out of the city and began to stone him. Meanwhile, the witnesses laid their coats at the feet of a young man named Saul. <sup>59</sup> While they were stoning him, <u>Stephen prayed</u>, "<u>Lord Jesus</u>, receive my spirit." <sup>60</sup> Then he fell on his knees and cried out, "<u>Lord, do not hold this sin against them</u>." When he had said this, he fell asleep. Acts 7:57-60 NIV

## 8. Stephen was martyred for a redemptive purpose.

On that day a great persecution broke out against the church in Jerusalem, and all except the apostles were scattered throughout <u>Judea</u> and <u>Samaria</u>. <sup>2</sup> Godly men buried Stephen and mourned deeply for him. <sup>3</sup> But <u>Saul began to destroy the church</u>. Going from house to house, he dragged off both men and women and put them in prison. <sup>4</sup> Those who had been scattered preached the word wherever they went. <sup>5</sup> Philip went down to a city in <u>Samaria</u> and <u>proclaimed the</u> Messiah there. <sup>6</sup> When the crowds <u>heard Philip and saw the signs he performed</u>, they all paid close attention to what he said. <sup>7</sup> For with <u>shrieks</u>, impure spirits came out of many, and <u>many who were paralyzed or lame were healed</u>. <sup>8</sup> So <u>there was great joy in that city</u>. Acts 8:1-8 NIV
